We have the chance to engage 5% or more of this wealth for permanent charitable funds to benefit our citizens and communities of today and generations to come in the Mountain State.

WHAT IS WEST VIRGINIA'S POTENTIAL?



The following are estimates for how the transfer of wealth could impact 38 of West Virginia's counties over the next 10 and 50 years if used for building community development philanthropy:

Current Net Worth:	\$97.6 Billion
10-year Transfer of Wealth:	\$30.2 Billion
10-year 5% Wealth Engagement:	\$1.51 Billion
5% Annual in Community Grants:	\$75.6 Million
50-year Transfer of Wealth:	\$260.2 Billion
50-year 5% Wealth Engagement:	\$13 Billion
5% Annual in Community Grants:	\$650 Million

These projections provide a conservative estimate on how West Virginia's communities can engage, keep and grow their local wealth for long-term community investments supporting community and economic development efforts.
